Climate

- Springs + temperatures increase by 37°F, from 31°F to 67°F, rarely falling below 9°F or exceeding 78°F.
- In the summer it is usually warm, in around the 70's or 50's.
- In the fall it's in 60's and 40's.
- It is the coldest in December, January, and February



Physical features of Edmonton

- Ripley's Aquarium of Canada (\$36.99)

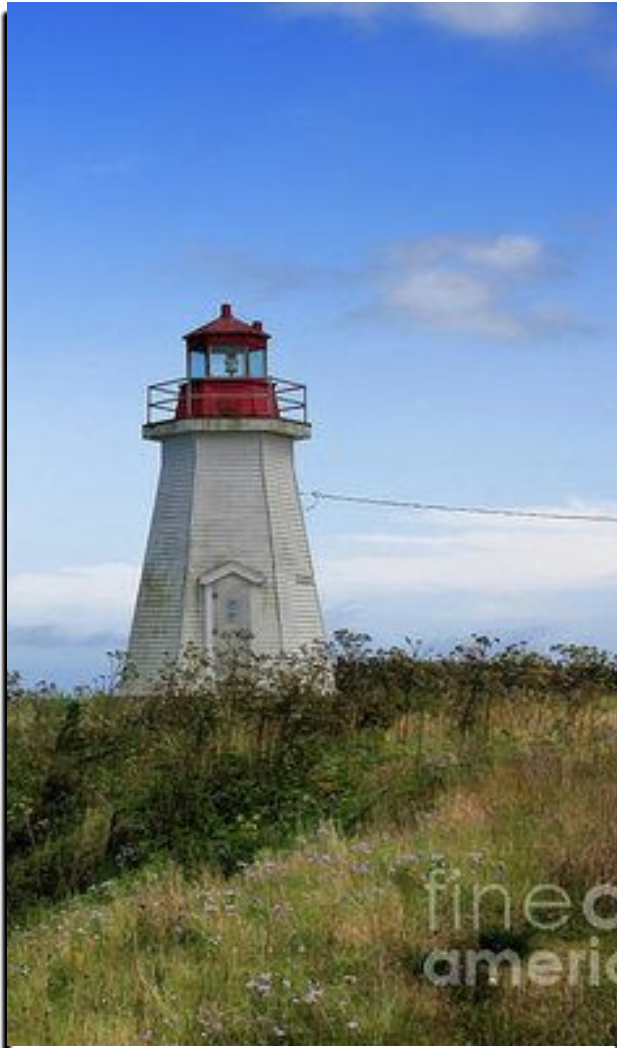
